Case Study— Pupil Premium—Context

Pupil Premium Funding
 The school expects to receive **£273,240** of Pupil Premium Funding.
 Currently, **207** pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding.

Disadvantaged Pupils Cohort
 There are currently **46%** disadvantaged pupils in the school.
 There are no identified Looked After children.

Specific Challenges Faced by the Disadvantaged Pupils Cohort
 Index of Multiple Deprivation demonstrates that school falls into one of the most deprived areas in the country for:
 Employment (70%+ IMD Band A)
 Health and Disability (70%+ IMD Band A)
 More than half of the pupils in each year group fall into IMD Band B, with an increased number falling into IMD Band A (most deprived in country).

Specific Challenges Faced by the Disadvantaged Pupils Cohort
