

### Pupil Premium Funding

The school expects to receive £250,840 of Pupil Premium Funding. Currently, 198 pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding.

### Disadvantaged Pupils Cohort

There are currently 50 % disadvantaged pupils in the whole school.

The overall proportion of YR – Y6 FSM pupils is **50%**; 198/404 pupils.

This compares to **more than double the national Pupil Premium rate** of 24.9% (national figure December 2016).

There are no identified Looked After children.
