Your children are certainly good 'Attendance Ambassadors'! They are very keen to aim for that 'Golden Train' each week. Good news indeed.



We raised a grand total of £245 on Red Nose Day. Thank you to everyone for their valued contributions.












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#### Family Learning

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#### School Uniform

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
Thank you for sending your child to school looking smart in their Timothy Hackworth School Uniform.
