Nursery - Summer Term 2017

This term we will continue to build on the children's interests in Minibeasts and we will continue to share books and find out facts about snails, spiders and worms...

We will also be exploring changes over time as we plant seeds and observe the lifecycle of a butterfly.

We have begun planting vegetables, herbs and flowers in our raised beds at Nursery; we hope to have a variety of healthy vegetables to harvest and cook with in the Autumn Term.

Physical activities continue to be a weekly focus. We still regularly use the large scale soft-play equipment to develop our co-ordination and balance skills. We now know a range of rhymes and we regularly warm up to our favourite songs!

This term we are also working on developing skills in using small apparatus, such as balls and beanbags with more control, as we prepare for our Sports Day celebrations. We will have further opportunities for family members to join us over the Summer Term during the 'Play and Stay' session, Father's Day Brunch and our end of term Praise Assembly. Our Foundation Stage Family Fun Day at South Shields is planned for the end of June and we hope that all the children will be able to join us for a fun-filled end of year party!













The children continue to enjoy selecting, sharing and stamping books of their own choice to bring back to Nursery from the local library.

Our latest Messy Day was great fun; the weather was so lovely we were able to work outside on a huge scale to complete activities that included spray painting and sensory exploration in clay, jelly and gloop.





On Tuesday 16th and Wednesday 17th May, all pupils from Year 6 visited Locomotion as part of their new History project about Timothy Hackworth. Their first stop was at Timothy Hackworth'a house where the children were given information about when Timothy lived there and who with. Hello and Welcome to your School Nursing Team's monthly Health update. Each month we will be contributing to your schools newsletter to keep you up to date with current and relevant child health issues and topics. This month we will be looking at the issue of **Head Lice and Nits.**

DID YOU KNOW HEAD LICE:

Feed by sucking blood on the scalp

Live in any hair length, clean or dirty

Cannot fly or jump, they spread by close head to head contact

Are most common in primary aged children although they can be caught in secondary school

Nits are what we call the eggs laid by head lice

The most effective way to detect if your child has head lice is to wet the child's hair and carry out wet detection combing.

Wash the hair using ordinary shampoo and then use a wide toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair. Apply any conditioner and once the comb moves freely through the hair, switch to a fine tooth comb (head lice comb).

Place the comb teeth against the scalp as close as possible and pull through the hair several times.

If a louse is found wipe comb with paper towel or an old towel.

Bug busting treatment can be continued throughout the hair by dividing the hair in sections and repeating this process.

Ensure a few lice are saved on cellotape and then these can be shown to the pharmacy to get free lotion for treatment.

Rinse out all the conditioner and use the comb through the hair one more time.

THE SAVED HEAD LICE CAN BE TAKEN TO THE CHEMIST AND THE CORRECT HEAD LICE TREATMENT PRESCRIBED. CONTINUE THIS TREATMENT AS PRESCRIBED ENSURING THAT ALL MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY WITH HEAD LICE ARE TREATED.

The wet combing method should be carried out twice weekly if possible in between treatment as this should be used again due to any eggs that may have hatched (as the life cycle of a head louse is 7-10 days).
