# Dining Room Charter – The right to be safe.



# Polling Day

Despite our continued attempts to arrange an alternative location for the Polling Day this year, we have been informed that our school will be used as a local Polling Station. For Safeguarding reasons, we will not have access to many parts of the school. It is therefore necessary to close the school on 7<sup>th</sup> May for children in Nursery, Reception, Y1,Y2,Y3,Y4 & Y5. 
