The right to be safe

Mrs. Hill and Mr. Hopkins recently organised a drop-in session for parents and carers to help make your child's mobile devices as safe as possible for their use. Unfortunately, this session was not well attended. Another session like this will be planned for the Autumn Term. If you need support with this, please contact Mrs. Hill or Mr. Hopkins at school and they will be more than happy to help.

Please be vigilant and help your child to stay safe online. Apps that have been brought to my attention due to inappropriate use by children (not in school) continue to be: 'Hangouts', 'Oovoo' and 'Yik Yak'.

School begins at 8.50 each morning and finishes at 3.30pm (Monday to Thursday) and 2.35pm (Friday). Please can you make every effort to ensure that your child arrives on the yard in time for the start of school; even 5 minutes late can mean they miss the important start to the day's learning. We have a very popular Breakfast Club which runs every morning during term time from 8am until 8.50am; the cost is £1.50 from 8am or 50p from 8.30am. It's not necessary to book a place, just bring your child along on the days you wish to use the Breakfast Club facility. If you are experiencing any difficulties please let us know as we may be able to help.

Attendance - Article 29 All children have the right to be the best that they can be.



Building Learning Powers



Article 28 Every child has the right to an education.

Article 29 Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full.

Article 12 Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously.

At our School we are proud to say that we have highly skilled learners who have a broad range of skills and strategies for learning. The Building Learning Powers (BLP) technique is intended to build upon these skills by giving our children the vocabulary of learning and to further develop their understanding of the skills that underpin learning across the curriculum.

Three times a year, within our classes, children discuss which Learning Powers they should as a class and as individuals, focus upon. They are asked to work out which skills they are already confident in and which they might benefit from developing. A vote is then taken to democratically choose up to four Learning Powers.

Last week children in years one to six used their pupil voices to complete a follow-up vote for members of their class who have been excellent or the most improved ambassadors for BLP. Mrs. Slattery awarded the winners star badges during last Friday's assembly.
