The Mini-Police have been very busy! They have been involved in a Mini-Police programme with Durham Agency Against Crime. The focus has been anti-social behaviour. The children have been working with Youth Development Workers. The programme has a three step approach:

- · Educate young people so that they are better equipped to make good choices, acquire skills and improve their opportunities.
- Develop children's sense of community, by contributing to the community and feeling a sense of achievement and belonging.
- · Take part in activities that build confidence, develop team work and provide the opportunity to learn new skills.

The children have delivered a whole school assembly, taken part in a host of exciting activities, completed a community litter-pick and attended a Mini-Police Launch Event at the Radisson Blu in Durham City. What an exciting time they have had!

Parking and Traffic - Please Help!

UNCRC Article 19 - All children have the right to be safe.

The Junior Road Safety Officers in school, alongside Miss Johnson, Mrs. Simpson, our Road Safety Crossing Patrol, staff, pupils and Governors continue to be very concerned about the parking issues around our school.

Parking and traffic issues are becoming even more problematic at the moment. We are very concerned about the safety of your children due to the amount of illegally parked cars, and general careless driving around our school.

We are keen to avoid any nasty accident involving children, busy traffic and parked cars, however, this is looking increasingly likely since traffic and parking issues are becoming more serious.

Please help your children stay safe by parking only in the designated areas around school, and by using the one-way system. Our pupils, Governors and staff are busy working on ideas to improve road safety but we need your help to do this.

Our ideas include:

- A 20mph speed limit request;
- Repainting of roadside markings;
- New signs;
- Increased parental support.

# A message from Our Governing Body Road Safety Issues at Our School CRC Article 19 – All children have the right to be safe.

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is with deep regret that the Governing Body must bring this issue to your attention.

As a result of feedback from many worried parents of children in our school, significant concerns have once again been raised regarding safety on the road and pathways around our school.

We have been further informed that cars are being parked irresponsibly and in breach of the Highway Code, on junctions, yellow lines, across driveways and the nearby bus stop.

We have witnessed this for ourselves, and in the interests of child, parent and staff safety, we strongly request that all adults using vehicles to drop off children or picking children up from school, park in a responsible manner.

We know the problems that parents and carers face and understand that at times it must be difficult, but the law must be upheld before we have a serious accident or worse which involves a child, or children.

We are mindful that the dark mornings and inclement weather are already upon us, so we ask that you all give a great deal of thought about where you might park your car.

As this is a busy time for all, can we also please ask that pathways are not blocked by pedestrians, as this is resulting in people having to go onto the roads to get past, again, creating another serious hazard.

We also strongly request parents using cars, to use the one-way voluntary system to reduce the risk of your child being hurt. This voluntary one-way system is for your child's safety. Please use it.

We are currently running a Road Safety Competition, organised by Miss Johnson and the Junior Road Safety Officers, regarding road and pedestrian safety at the school gates. As part of this competition, we are welcoming any ideas that can be shared to reduce the risk of children being hurt by irresponsible drivers.

As a Rights Respecting School, we feel that your child's safety is becoming increasingly at risk due to the serious road safety issues around our school. We look forward to a safer environment outside of our school gates.

We can only do this if everyone acts in a responsible way, and with your child's well-being in mind.
