I am new to this group.



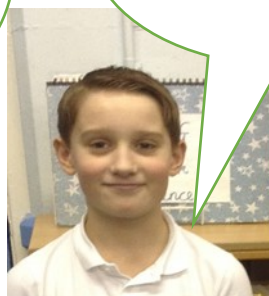
I love learning and sharing ideas.
