## Anne Frank Workshop in Year 6

The focus of the workshop was on the key words stereotype, prejudice and discrimination. Grace, the workshop leader, linked these words to the life of Anne Frank. The children were encouraged to think about identity and what makes people who they are. This linked to Article 7: All children have the right to their own identity. They also found out that Anne was denied the right to her identity and was stereotyped because of her religion. Grace also brought some eye witness accounts from Holocaust survivors from which the children were able to identify examples of prejudice and discrimination against Jews by the Nazis. This linked to Article 8 (Governments should respect your identity) and Article 14 (the right to follow your own religion). By the end of the workshop the children had a better understanding of identity, stereotype, prejudice and discrimination as well as having learned more about the life of Anne Frank.

The children listened attentively and responded thoughtfully to the questions and points raised and showed their understanding of children's rights as well as equality and diversity.
