Information for Parents

for the Full Reopening of Timothy Hackworth Primary School on Monday 8th March 2021

Dear Parents and Carers,

24th February, 2021

We very much look forward to welcoming all children back to school full time on Monday 8th March. As you will appreciate, due to Government guidance, the school day will continue to look very different to the school day that we would normally have. Essentially, the school day will be very similar to that of the Autumn Term, when children were in school before the Christmas Holidays.

Our ultimate aim is to keep your children, you and our staff safe. We therefore have in place a rigorous and comprehensive Risk Assessment. The following information links to our Risk Assessment. Although we do not intend for the information below to be in any way negative or obstructive, it is essential that the information is clear and is clearly understood to ensure the safety of everyone in these circumstances. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

We are here to support your children and your family. We therefore expect parents to be following all of the social distancing protocols as part of the Government guidance, in order to protect everyone in our school community.

We value communication with you and are keen to continue with this, however, during this virus period, parents and carers will only be able to continue to speak to staff on the telephone. If you wish to communicate with staff, please call the School Office and they will ask the relevant member of staff to call you back. Please be aware this may not be until the end of the day or perhaps the next day.

The following guidance is in line with Government requirements for school opening on 8th March 2021:

- Our enhanced school cleaning programme will continue, where our strict cleaning regime will continue to operate. This will include the cleaning of resources.

- Routines will continue to be in place for regular handwashing throughout the day.
- Children should not bring hand sanitiser into school as we have an ample supply of this.
- There will be no After School Clubs.
- There will be no events for parents.
- Staff will not be wearing PPE. However, we must wear PPE to administer close First Aid or to supervise the isolation of a symptomatic child if 2m distancing cannot be maintained. This is a Government recommendation.

Attendance

- Attendance is compulsory from 8th March 2021. All children are required, by the Government, to be in school full-time, from this date. We expect children to attend school from 8th March.
- Our timetable from the Autumn Term which already includes staggered start and finish times will continue from 8th March onwards until further notice. Please see timetable below.
- Children to arrive to school at the allocated times. Being punctual is important. It is important not to be early, as well as not to be late, due to the staggered start times.
- Parents must telephone school if their child will be absent due to illness, and to give reasons why.

Bubbles

- Your child will continue to be in the same Class Bubble with their teacher and teaching assistant, just as they were in the Autumn Term.
- The Bubble will not mix at all with any other Bubbles. They will learn together, play together and eat together. The Government's guidance stipulates that Bubbles of children must not mix together, just the same as in the Autumn Term.

Beginning and end of the school day

- The beginning and end of the day will continue to be staggered and a variety of entrances and exits will continue to be used. The length of the school day will remain the same for all Bubbles, but not every Bubble will start at the same time.
- Children must arrive within their allocated timings. Punctuality is very important, particularly at this current time.

- **Breakfast Club: Children of Key Workers and vulnerable children, who have accessed Breakfast Club since January 2021, will be able to continue to attend Breakfast Club from 8th March. Unfortunately, Breakfast Club will **not** be able to be accessed by any other children due to limited capacity and Government guidance. This will be reviewed when further information from the Government becomes available.**

- Parents should avoid coming onto the school site wherever possible.

- Children in Years 5 and 6 are able to walk home alone but please let us know if this is your preference.

- Parents should stay away from the school building, behind the coned areas on the Front and Middle playgrounds, and will be asked to stay as far away as possible to Reception, Nursery and 2 Year Old doors to avoid unnecessary congestion and to maintain distancing.

- **Parents and carers must continue to socially distance from each other when on the school site, including the area outside of school where Reception children enter and exit;**

- **Parents and carers must continue to wear face coverings before entering the school site;**

- **Only one parent or carer must drop off / collect their child. Please do not arrive to school with any other adults;**

- **Parents and carers must not gather at school entrances/exits;**

- **Parents and carers must not gather around the local streets after collecting / dropping off children;**

- Children should go straight to their parent and then the child and parent should leave the premises immediately.

What should my child bring / not bring to school?

- Children are NOT allowed to bring their bikes or scooters to school.
- Children can bring a bag with a labelled water bottle.
- They should bring a coat for outdoors.
- They should wear layers of clothes if the weather is cooler, as classrooms are required to be well ventilated.
- They should bring their packed lunch if necessary.
- Mobile Phones should not be brought into school.

Lunches

- All children in school will be entitled to a hot school lunch from 8th March.
- If your child is entitled to a free school meal they will be able to have a free hot school lunch. If your child is in Year 1 or Year 2, a free hot school lunch will be provided also. If you prefer, your child can bring in a packed lunch from home.
- Parents can purchase a hot school lunch via Parent Pay. Please contact the School Office for more details if necessary.
- If your child does bring a packed lunch from home, please be aware that this will be stored in the classroom. As classrooms can be warm, please think carefully about what you put into the lunch box. Meat and fish products should be avoided.
- If your child brings a packed lunch into school, please ensure that this is a healthy packed lunch. Packed lunches should not include chocolate bars or sweets. A packed lunch should include, for example, a savoury sandwich, yogurt, fruit and water.

Uniform

- We expect your child to wear their full school uniform.
- Trainers, jewellery, Fitness Trackers and Smart Watches are not allowed.
- Children will not be allowed to wear face masks.
- A full PE Kit is needed by all children in school on Monday 8th March.

- Detailed information about school uniform, including PE Kit, is available on our school website.

Learning

- We will continue to teach a broad and balanced curriculum.
- Children will bring home a reading book and their reading record book each Monday. These will need to be returned to school every Friday.
- Please ensure that any reading books your child might still have at home are sent back to school with your child on Monday 8th March. Any other school books that you may have found during Lockdown that belong to school, please return them to school with your child – no questions asked!
- Maths homework will be sent out on a Wednesday and will need to be returned on a Monday. Please note that homework may not be marked if it is not returned on time.
- Children will take spellings home to learn and will have a spelling test each week.
- There will be no swimming for Year 3 children until further notice.

Remote Learning

- Remote Learning from 8th March will be very different. This is because all children are expected to attend school full-time from the 8th March, and all staff in school will be face-to-face teaching;
- Remote Learning will only be provided for children who are absent from school with CV19 symptoms, who have had a positive CV19 test, or who are required to isolate;
- Children who are absent from school due to these reasons will be provided with a school laptop to access their Remote Learning, alongside a paper-based pack;
- A teacher from your child's year group will make contact with you and your child as soon as possible, so that the remote learning tasks can be discussed, and any help that your child might need with their learning can be provided;
- A teacher from your child's year group will make daily contact with you and your child for the duration of their Covid-related absence;

- All Remote Learning is expected to be completed. Your child's Remote Learning will be marked and feedback will be provided. This will be through Class Dojo. Remote Learning will no longer be available on the school website from 8th March;
- If your child is in 2 Year Olds, Nursery or Reception, the majority of the Remote Learning will focus on practical tasks for your child to complete, with your support. The teacher will be able to give you more details about these tasks when contact is made.

What if my child becomes ill at school?

- We require the names and telephone numbers of at least two emergency contacts. We will be testing these numbers to ensure they are in operation. If you need to update the information we have for you, please call the School Office.
- If your child shows any signs of illness we will call you and you must collect your child immediately. It is absolutely vital that parents and carers answer the phone straight away.
- If your child shows any symptoms of the virus, they will be placed in supervised isolation whilst they wait for you to arrive.
- Symptomatic children must be tested. If the test is negative, and the child no longer has symptoms, the child can return to school. Evidence would be required of this. A child or adult who has a confirmed case would be required to self-isolate for ten days. The household would be required to self-isolate for ten days also.
- Where there is a confirmed case within a Class Bubble, the children and staff within that Class Bubble would be sent home to isolate for ten days. The other household members would not need to self-isolate unless their child displayed symptoms and subsequently tested positive.
- In the event of a Local Lockdown, school would be in regular contact with Public Health England and advice would be issued accordingly.

NHS Test and Trace

- Along with staff members, parents and carers need to be ready and willing to engage with Test and Trace procedures.
- Parents, carers and children need to:
 - Book a test if they are displaying symptoms;
 - Must not come onto the school premises if they have symptoms: a persistent cough, a high temperature and/or a loss of taste and smell;

- Be prepared to self-isolate if they have any symptoms;
- Provide details of anyone who they have been in close contact with if they test positive, or if asked by NHS Test and Trace;
- Self-isolate if they have been in close contact with someone who develops Coronavirus symptoms or someone who tests positive;
- Parents need to inform school immediately of any results of a test.

Behaviour

- Please refer to our Respectful Relationships Policy (Behaviour Policy) and related updated appendix in light of current circumstances. These documents are available on our school website.
- **We will not tolerate the behaviour of any child who puts the safety of another child, children or staff at risk. You would be contacted should this be necessary.**
- **We will not tolerate the behaviour of any parent or carer who puts the safety of another child, children, staff or parent/carer at risk. Parents will not be welcome onto the school site if their behaviour is unacceptable.**

Precautions at Home

- When your child returns home they should thoroughly wash and dry their hands;
- Water bottles must be washed thoroughly;
- Lunch boxes should be cleaned with anti-bacterial spray – inside and outside.

Please talk to your child/children about the changes so they will be prepared for school.

Information will be reviewed and updated as it becomes available. We will continue to inform parents and carers as soon as possible of any updated information.

We appreciate your support in these difficult times. The above Health and Safety measures reflect Government guidance. Our ultimate aim is to keep you, your children and our staff safe.

We really look forward to welcoming your child/children back to school on Monday 8th March.
