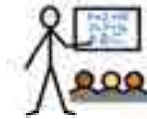




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2 Year Olds & Nursery Remote Learners

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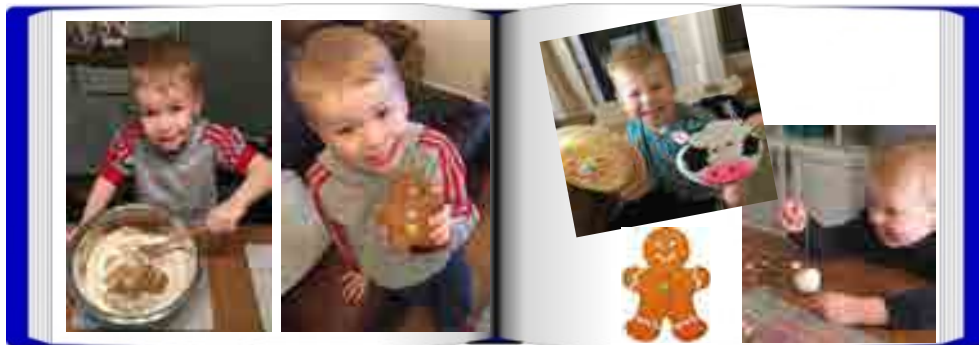


2 Year Olds & Nursery Remote Learners

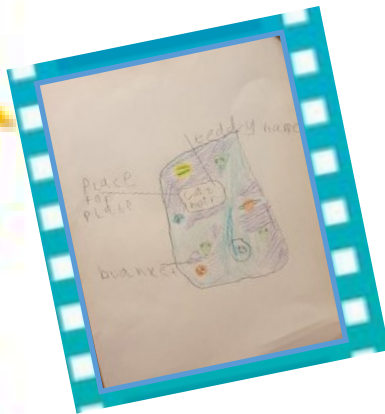
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Year 1 Remote Learners

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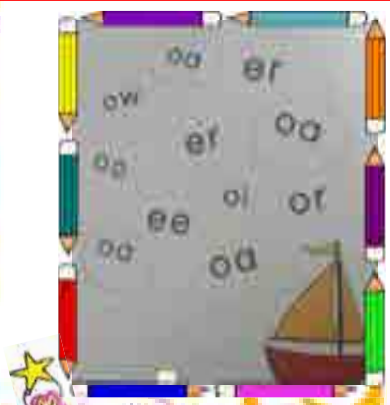


Year 3 Remote Learning

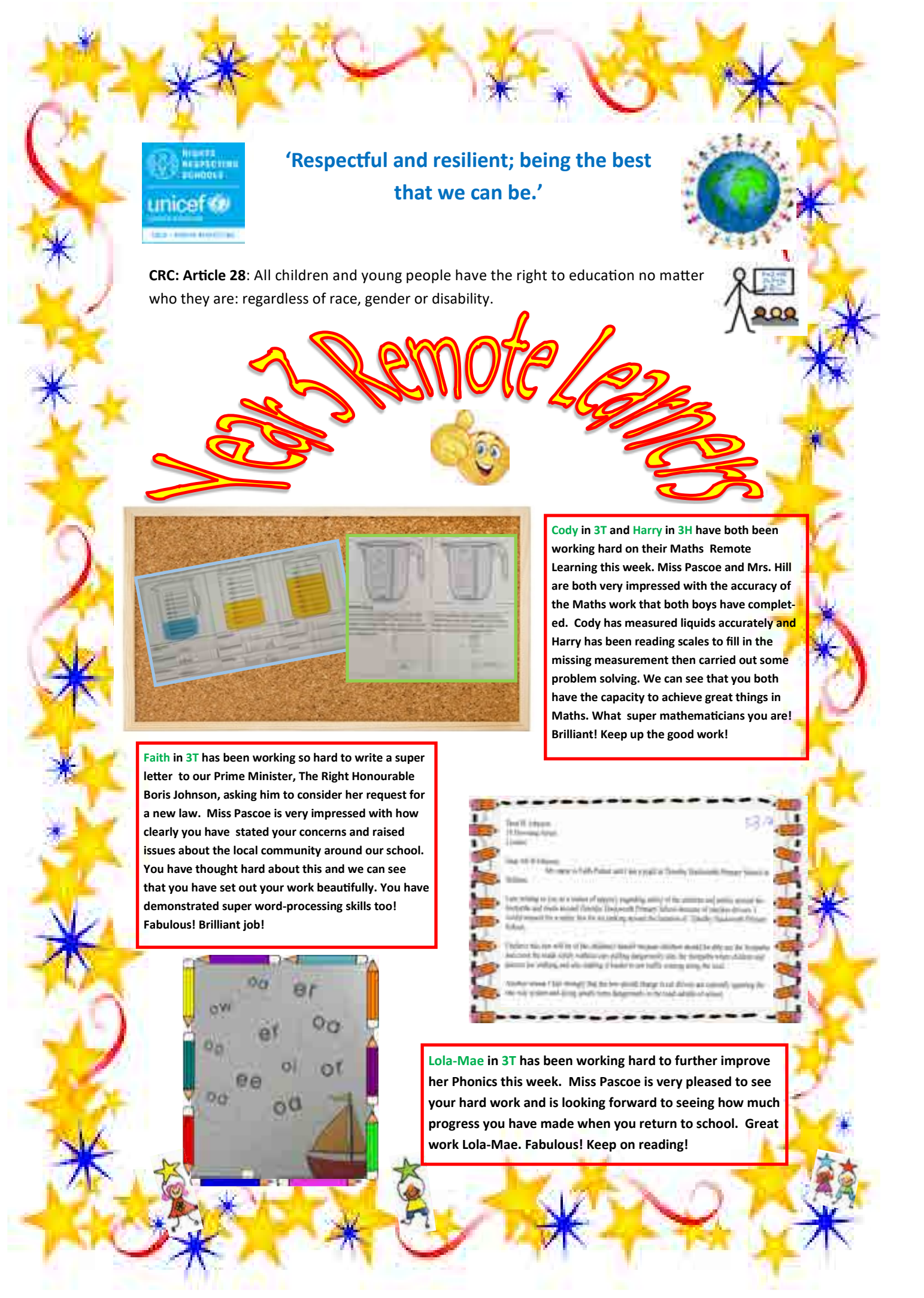

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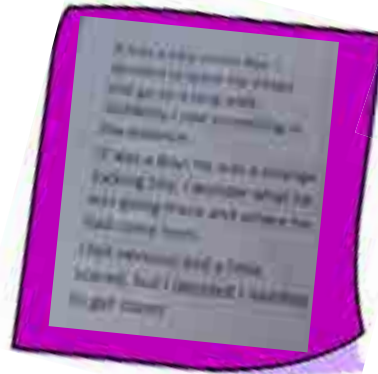


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Year 3 Remote Learners

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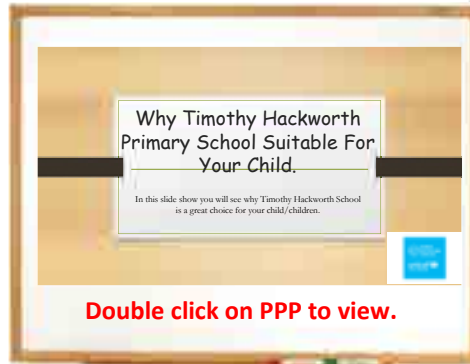
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Year 6 Remote Learning

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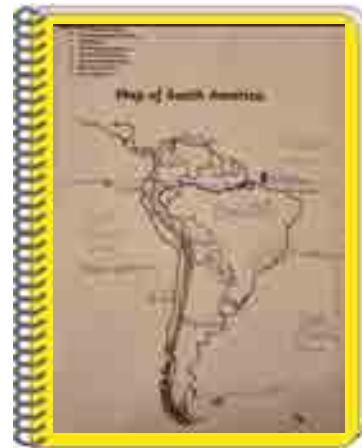
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Year 6 Remote Learners
