Caring for others

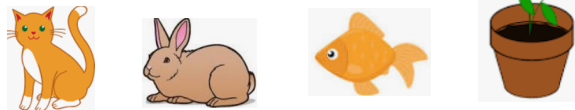
A community is a group of people living or working together. A community cares for each other.
