Web Navigation Skills

The internet allows you to find information in seconds. You can use search engines to do this.

Websites each have a URL for example:

www.bbc.co.uk

Remember that not all information on the internet is reliable, so check where you are getting information from.

.com = commercial website

.co.uk = UK website

.org = non-profit organisation

.net = companies in a network

.gov = government website


Avoid clicking on advert hyperlinks as they can lead you to a new website or harm your device.



Understanding Networks

Computers are linked together by a network. Information is passed between different devices within

this network.



A wireless access point is a device that can connect

that can connect multiple other devices with one another.


A **server** is a networked computer for saving files.

Understanding Algorithms

You need an algorithm before you can write a code. This will allow you to send instructions to a device.

Sometimes the device will show **errors** and not complete the correct instructions.

You can prevent errors by using **logical reasoning** or following the correct rules for the device.



You will need to think about what you are telling the device
to do: move forward one space, turn left, move forward
two spaces.
