

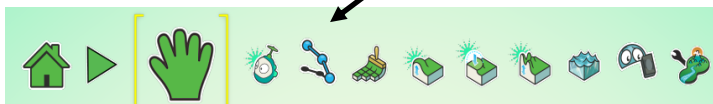
# Year 4: Computing and Online Safety

Opening page of Kodu

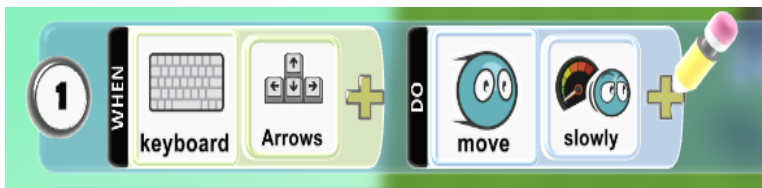
Tool Palette



Click on the ground to add an item to your world.



Right mouse click on your object to program it.



Click on **WHEN** and choose 'if clicked' or 'mouse keys' etc.

Then click on **DO** and click on what you want the object to do.

Then press 'Escape' to run the program.



## Vocabulary

<b>flatten</b>	To reduce down and make flat.	<b>raise</b>	To make higher or taller.
<b>Kodu</b>	An online program using code.	<b>ridicule</b>	To make fun of.
<b>mockery</b>	To insult someone and laugh in an unkind way.	<b>smooth</b>	Flat and not bumpy.
<b>nodes</b>	Dots joined to lines to where an item will travel.	<b>terrain</b>	Type of flooring or ground, e.g. grass.
<b>object</b>	An item from the Tool Palette that can be added in Kodu.	<b>tool palette</b>	A menu bar going across the screen showing different objects to use.
<b>obstacle</b>	An item to put in the way of another in Kodu.	<b>track</b>	A route to travel around.
<b>program editor</b>	This will show the instructions in the order that they are written.	<b>world</b>	The main place to add things in Kodu.

## Online Safety

### Being Respectful Online

**Being respectful online is when you interact with others in a way that shows that you care about their well-being and how they feel.**

When you respect someone, you:

- treat them kindly.
- use good manners.
- say nice things.
- keep their information private.
- behave in the same way as if the person were in front of you.

### Remember:

Talk to a trusted adult if someone is mean or rude to you online. Never respond to mean messages.



**Don't share everything about you online. Keep personal information private. If you are unsure of what you should share, ask a trusted adult.**

**1** People you don't know are strangers. They're not always who they say they are.

**2** Be nice to people like you would on the playground.

**3** Keep your personal information private.

**4** If you ever get that 'uh oh' feeling, tell a grown-up you trust.
