Databases

A database is a computerised system that makes it easy to search, select and store information. Databases are used in many different places.

A school might use a database to store information about attendance, or to store pupils' and teachers' contact information. A database like this will probably be protected with a password to make sure that people's personal information is kept safe.

Every item you put into your database is called a 'record'.

Each record will have its own row with all the information you want store about it.

The columns of the table are called 'fields'. For example, you might have columns for 'type of equipment', 'cost', 'size' and 'location'

You can use the information in the fields to search your database.
