

Year 4: Computing and Online Safety

Databases

A **database** is a computerised system that makes it easy to **search, select and store** information. Databases are used in many different places.

A school might use a database to store information about attendance, or to store pupils' and teachers' contact information. A database like this will probably be **protected with a password** to make sure that people's personal information is kept safe.

Every item you put into your database is called a **'record'**.

Each record will have its own **row** with all the information you want to store about it.

The **columns** of the table are called **'fields'**. For example, you might have columns for 'type of equipment', 'cost', 'size' and 'location'.

You can use the information in the fields to **search** your database.

battery	A source of power.
column	The vertical section of a database.
computerised	Performed or produced by a computer.
data	Pieces of information.
database	A computerised system for searching, selecting and storing information.
device	A computerised piece of equipment, e.g., a phone, tablet or computer.
digital wellbeing	The impact of technology on your physical or mental health.
excessive	More than necessary or too much.
fields	The cells of the database that store information.
overuse	To use more than necessary or too much.
record	Every item you put in a database.
reflect	To consider or think something over.
row	The horizontal section of a database.
search	To look for something, e.g., a record.
select	To click or choose a record.
sleep	Sleep allows your body and mind to recharge.
store	To keep and save a record for future use.
switch off	Turn off your device and come offline.
titles	The heading given to your database; what your overall database is about.
vision	The state of being able to see.
