Algorithms - Scratch

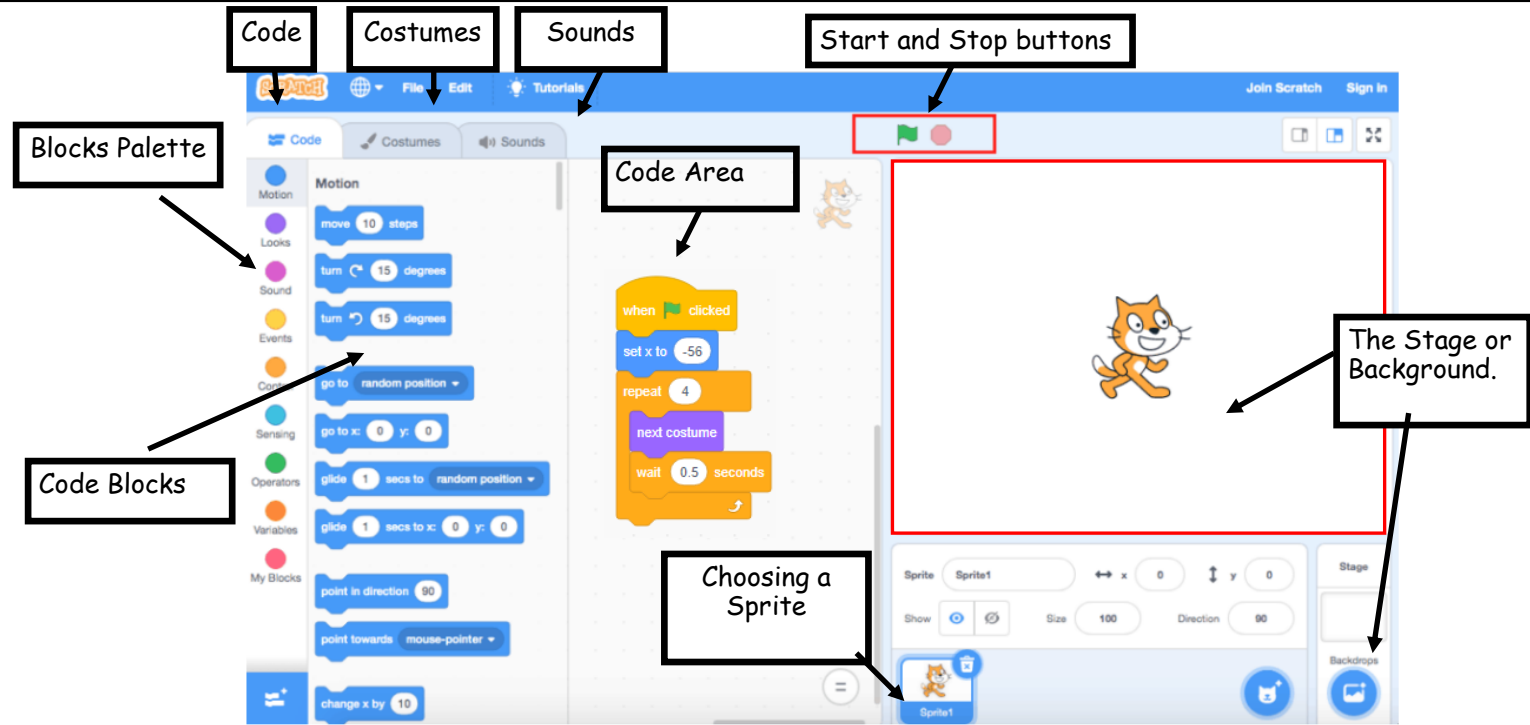
The **code blocks** are on the left hand side. Drag the blocks onto the code area.

To choose a different costume, click on the tab **Costumes**, and again drag across onto the code area.

To add sounds, click on the **Sounds** tab and click on the bottom blue speaker to choose your sound.

After you have added your code, click the green flag to watch your animation.

Click the red button to stop the animation.

Being respectful online means:

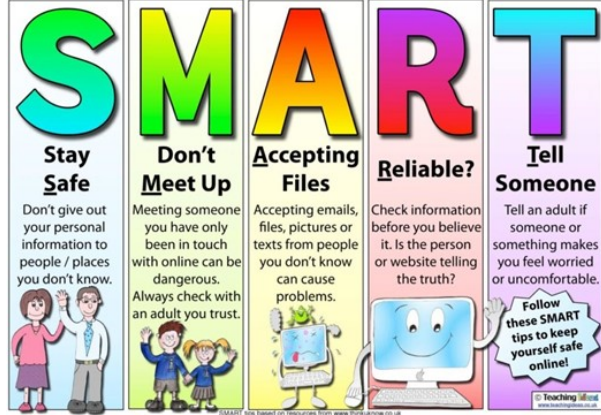
- Respecting the boundaries of others.

Vocabulary

boundaries	An invisible line between ourselves and other people.
code block	A visual representation for a section of code that performs a certain job. They can be snapped together to build a program.
conditional statement	A rule which states that something can not happen until certain requirements are met.
procedure	A set of computer instructions that perform a specific task.
Scratch	A coding program in which you can develop interactive games and animations.
self respect	Being nice to yourself.
Variable	To set a value yourself, such as a score.
