
Your Imagination

Here is the introduction for Supercalifragilistic expialidocious. It tells us on the score it is 120 beats per minute. In Italian the musical term for this tempo is **Allegro Moderato**. This means fairly quickly. We can use a **metronome** to help us keep a steady tempo.
