

Year 6: So what do we know about Christianity?

AUTHORITY

We have learnt that the Christians see the **Bible** as sacred and holy. Through its stories, accounts, poems and teaching the Bible helps Christians:

- know about God and Jesus;
- know how to live their lives;
- feel comforted and supported;
- consider their own attitudes and feelings.

BELIEF

We have learnt that Christians believe:

- God is the Creator, the Loving Saviour (forgiving) and Powerful;
- God is three in one (the Trinity);
- Jesus is the Son of God;
- Jesus was a teacher and miracle worker;
- Jesus changes lives.

EXPRESSIONS OF BELIEF

We have learnt that Christians express their beliefs through worship in all sorts of different ways, e.g., through music, prayer, objects and rituals. We have learnt that not all Christians worship in the same way; there is diversity.

IMPACT OF BELIEF

We have learnt that having a belief makes a difference to the way Christians live their lives and act. This can make a difference to the people they help as well.
