
## Reflect, Rewind and Replay

### The Pentatonic Scale

The Pentatonic Scale is made up of 5 notes. This type of scale is used most commonly in music from China, but is found in all music from around the world.

### **Grid Notation**

We can use a grid to show a variety of things: which notes to play, how many times to play the note, and to show when the piece begins and ends. The grid can show non-musical symbols or letters to represent the sounds and how they go together.





### **Pentatonic Melody**

Using the 5 notes of the Pentatonic Scale, we can select an order to play on the glockenspiel. For example:

### Round

Music that is repeated from different starting points.



### What is call and response?

The leader, or lead group, plays a musical pattern called 'the call'. The rest of the group respond with a matching pattern or response.
