What does faith mean?

Faith is a belief in a particular religion and its teachings.

What is a community?

A community is group of people who live closely together or have shared interests.

Christianity

Christians model themselves on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Jesus taught people to love God and love their neighbour.

The Christian holy book is the Bible. It is divided into the Old and New Testaments. Many Christians worship in churches



Sikhism

Sikhs believe in one God, the brotherhood and equality for all men and women.

Their place of worship is called the **Gurdwara**.

The holy book of Sikhism is the Guru Granth Sahib Ji.

Buddhists follow the teachings of a man called **Siddhattha Gotama**. He became known as the **Buddha**, which means 'enlightened'.



The Buddhist scriptures are known as the **Tipitaka**, which means 'three baskets'.

In Buddhist countries there are many temples. People bring flowers and incense to the shrine and food for the monks.

<u>Islam</u>

Muslims believe in one God, Allah, who has many characteristics.

The Muslim holy book is called the Qur'an.

Muslims worship in a building called a mosque.
