Hip Hop began in America in the 1970s.

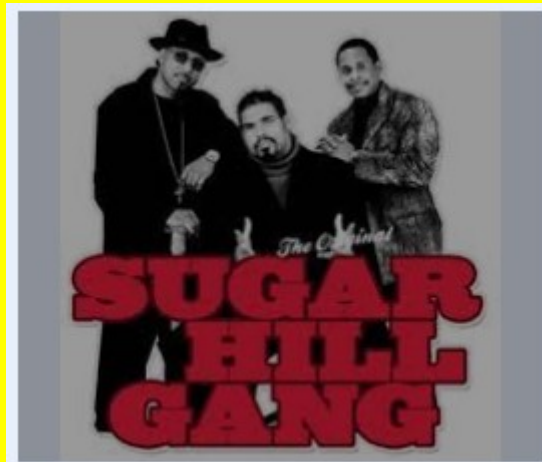
It includes programmed beats, rapping and samples.

A sample is a short, recorded sound often played back in a sequence from an electronic device called a 'sampler' or a 'drum machine'. The rapping element could be traced back to Africa where, centuries ago, people told stories rhythmically over the beats of drums.



Sample Pad - this can be used to upload sounds to be played back in musical compositions.
