

Reggae music began in Jamaica and became popular in the late 1960s. Before becoming the name of a genre, the term 'Reggae' is said by some to have meant ragged clothing, quarrel, or a row.



B-Boying is a highly expressive dance developed in the Bronx of New York City, USA. This type of dancing is done to Hip Hop music.



Other instruments popular in Reggae music include the saxophone, brass instruments, electric guitars, bass and backing singers. Bob Marley is considered one of the pioneers of Reggae. Reggae songs are often about love, religion and social issues.
