


## Glockenspiel Stage One.

## <u>Theme</u>

Learn to play and read the notes C, D, E + F on a glockenspiel.

Rests represent silence in music.





The glockenspiel is played with unwrapped mallets made of hard material, such as metal (usually brass or aluminium) or a type of polymer, for example, acrylic. Non-metal mallets are used for general playing, while metal mallets produce a more brilliant sound.

The main difference between a xylophone and a glockenspiel (metallophone) is the material used for the bars. The xylophone uses wood, whereas the glockenspiel and metallophone use metal.

Vocabulary	
beat	To make a rhythmic sound.
crotchet	Musical note with the time value of one beat.
duration	The length of a note.
glockenspiel	A percussion instrument with a set of tuned keys arranged in the fashion of a piano keyboard.
notes	A symbol representing a musical sound.
staff	A set of 5 horizontal lines and four spaces that each represent a different musical pitch.
texture	Texture describes how layers of sound within a piece of music interact.
treble clef	Musical notation used to show which pitch should be played in music.
