Why do we wear a poppy, today, on Remembrance Day?

- Remembrance Day is held on the 11th of November: the 11th day of the 11th month of the year.
- A two minute silence is always held at 11.00 a.m. to remember the millions who have died at war.



- On Remembrance Day, people will wear their poppies and lay wreaths of poppies on statues and monuments to remember all the soldiers who have died in wars and conflicts, in their efforts to help to save others.



- Poppies are worn on Remembrance Day because they are the flowers which grew on the battlefields after World War I ended.
