
## Year 3: Music

## Three Little Birds

Robert Nesta Marley OM was a Jamaican singer, musician and songwriter. Considered one of the pioneers of Reggae, his musical career was marked by fusing elements of Reggae, Ska, and Rocksteady, as well as his distinctive vocal and song writing style.





Tempo means the speed at which a piece of music should be played. As with many other musical terms, Italian words are used to describe different tempos of music. Sometimes a metronome mark is used with the beats per minute. Writing the term for the tempo and the BPM gives the musician reading the music a very clear idea of how it should be played.

Tempo Marking	Meaning	<b>Beats Per Minute</b>
Largo	Slow and broad	40-60 bpm
Larghetto	Slow and broad, but a little bit faster than largo	60-66 bpm
Adagio	Slow with great expression	66-76 bpm
Andante	A walking pace	76-108 bpm
Moderato	At a moderate speed	108-120 bpm
Allegro	Fast, quick, and bright	120-156 bpm
Vivace	Lively and fast	156-176 bpm
Presto	Very, very fast	168-200 bpm
Prestissimo	Eeven faster than presto	200 bpm and over
