Language Learning Skills

Using a **speaking frame** can help to create accurate, spoken sentences.

Using a **writing frame** can help to create sentences with accurate spelling and punctuation.

Pronunciation the grapheme *oi*

In English, the grapheme 'oi' is pronounced as in oil, boil and soil.

In French, it is pronounced as in *poisson, bois, trois* and *étoile*.

Grammar Gender

In French, nouns are divided into 2 categories: masculine and feminine. In French, all nouns have a gender. In English nouns do not have a grammatical gender.

Grammar verb

A verb expresses an action or a state of being. It describes what is happening. It is sometimes called a 'doing word' because it describes what someone does.

Grammar pronoun

A pronoun can replace a noun. English subject pronouns include *I, you, he, she, it, we* and *they*. The French pronoun *je* is the equivalent of the English pronoun 'I'.

Grammar cognate

A cognate is a word in one language that is related in origin to a word in another language.
