We would like to say a big thank you from all the staff here at The Village Optician for your hard work collecting glasses for people in need.

The glasses have gone to the Lions Club International. This is a charity that has been around since 1917 to help communities around the world.

The first thing that happens to the glasses is they will be sorted into different prescriptions. This is done by measuring each pair with a machine called a focimeter.

They are then packaged into different groups of lens powers or strengths and stored ready to be sent overseas for the next mission. Groups of volunteers made up of eyecare professionals and specially trained glasses dispensers, will go on these missions and do vision screenings to match the collected glasses to the eyes of the children and adults with vision problems.

Did you Know? The World Health Organization estimates that there are over 120 million people who are visually impaired (can't see very well) due to the lack of access to basic services. Services that we, living in the United Kingdom take for granted.

The glasses which you have collected will allow many people to see clearly for the first time, some of which will allow children just like you to attend school and get a better education.

Who knows, maybe one day you may also be interested in going abroad to help!

- . Keep looking and listening for traffic while crossing.






Stop before you cross the road, You need to know the Green Cross Code.
