## You will need:

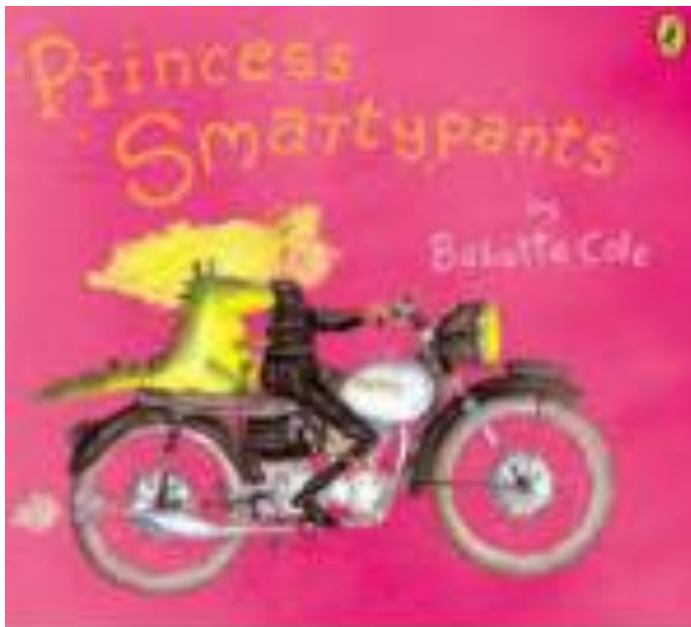
- 200g milk chocolate broken into pieces
- 85g shredded wheat
- 2 x 100g bags chocolate eggs
- Cupcake cases



## Method:

1. Melt the chocolate in a bowl and place over a pan of barely simmering water (with an adult's help). Pour the chocolate over your choice of cereal and stir well.
2. Spoon the chocolate cereal into 12 cupcake cases and use the back of a spoon to create a nest shape. Place 3 chocolate eggs on top and set in the fridge for 2 hours.
